Rep. Todd Hunter Will Host Human Trafficking Summit in Corpus Christi

CORPUS CHRISTI, TEXAS – Rep. Todd Hunter (R – Corpus Christi), along with Del Mar College, is hosting lawmakers, academics, educators and law enforcement professionals at a summit to discuss how Human Trafficking has become a growing threat to Texans. The Honorable Senfronia Thompson, Chairman of the House Local and Consent Calendars Committee in the Texas Legislature, and Ken Paxton, Texas Attorney General will give keynote addresses.

“Texas needs to continue to be a leader in creating laws to stop Human Trafficking,” Representative Todd Hunter said. “My hope is that by bringing together some of our state’s most notable experts on the topic, we can continue to raise public awareness and work together to make sure we are doing everything we can to put a stop to this horrific industry.”

A panel of education leaders will be discussing topics related to human trafficking in schools and colleges, the Office of the Governor will give an overview, Sheriff A. J. “Andy” Louderback will discuss the dangers of human trafficking in Texas and Bishop Michael Mulvey will speak on the role of the Diocese. Catrina Wilson, Pres. and CEO of the United Way of the Coastal Bend will give an update on Domestic Violence.

Hunter said, “The statistics shared at this summit by experts will do a great deal to convince the will of Texans to end these patterns of corruption and evil. Just imagine what kind of power Texans could have against this problem if they knew as much as we are learning from events like this.”

The Human Trafficking Summit will take place on September 18th at the Center for Economic Development, at Del Mar College, at 3209 South Staples Street. Registration begins at 8:00 a.m., with a keynote address by Texas Attorney General, Ken Paxton at 9:45 a.m. The Summit ends at 3:00 p.m.
